PROFILE



BIMP-EAGA COVERAGE

The Brunei Darussalam-Indonesia-Malaysia-Philippines East ASEAN Growth Area (BIMP-EAGA) was created in 1994 to accelerate the socio-economic development of less-developed, marginalized and geographically remote areas in these four countries as a broader goal to narrow development gaps. The BIMP-EAGA covers the entire sultanate of Brunei Darussalam: the provinces of Kalimantan, Sulawesi, Maluku and Papua in Indonesia; the states of Sabah and Sarawak, and the Federal Territory of Labuan in Malaysia; and the island of Mindanao and the province of Palawan in the Philippines.

LAND AREA



The BIMP-EAGA covers a land area of 1.6 million square kilometres which accounted for **62.4%** of BIMP.

POPULATION



In 2017, the BIMP-EAGA has a combined population of **75.8 million** that is equivalent to 19.0% of BIMP's population. The BIMP-EAGA is a sparsely populated area with a population density of mere 48 persons per square kilometre.



While for **labour force**, the BIMP-EAGA accounted for 17.8% of BIMP's labour force.

ECONOMIC PERFORMANCE

GDP AT CURRENT PRICES



The EAGA GDP at current prices registered at US\$287.3 billion and accounted for 17.4% of BIMP. The GDP at current PPP\$ recorded at PPP\$880.7 billion.

TRADE IN GOODS

The EAGA trade in aoods recorded at US\$102.7 billion and contributed about 11.3% from BIMP.

2017 show EAGA is lagging behind BIMP. However, EAGA's GDP growth rate

surpassed ASEAN's growth rate. GDP per capita at current US\$ and PPP\$ for EAGA is still lower than BIMP and













EAGA GDP AT CURRENT PPP\$, 2017

SHARE OF EAGA GDP IN ASEAN, GDP AT CURRENT PPP\$ 2017




SIZE OF EAGA IN BIMP, GDP AT CURRENT PPP\$, 2017




EMPLOYMENT² & POVERTY³



In **2017**, the **unemployment rate in EAGA** recorded a **downward trend** when compared to 2011 except for **Philippines-EAGA**.

The **poverty incidence in EAGA** region continued to be on a **downtrend** but **higher than the national position**.

TRADE IN GOODS, EAGA




EAGA exports in 2017 continued to dominate total trade where trade balance **rose** 39.2% to US\$ 54.7 billion as compared to 2016.



INTER AND EXTRA-EAGA TRADE

In **2017**, trade with the rest of the world (extra-EAGA) **dominated** trade in goods of BIMP-EAGA with a share of 91.1%. While, 8.9% of goods were traded with BIMP (inter-EAGA).





Exports and imports for extra-EAGA trade for **all EAGAs exceeded** 80% except for Brunei's imports (79.1%).


In 2017, **investment** for **BIMP & EAGA** recorded a **decrease** of **42.2%** and **39.1%** respectively when **compared to 2016**.

For the term of 2013-2017, size of investment in EAGA shrank with annual change of 12.0% where FDI and domestic investment decreased annually by 14.0% and 6.4% respectively.

In 2017, **Brunei** and **Indonesia-EAGA** recorded an **increase in FDI**, except for **Malaysia-EAGA** and **Philippines-EAGA** recorded a **decrease of 85.8% and 72.3%** respectively. While for domestic investment, only **Indonesia-EAGA** recorded a **decrease of 9.7%**.

⁵ Investment refers to realized investment in Brunei Darussalam in all sectors; realized investment in all sector except upstream oil and gas, and finance and banking for Indonesia; approved investment in the manufacturing sector only for Malaysia; and realized investment in all sectors for the Philippines.
