









## **BIMP-EAGA AT A GLANCE**

A Statistical Information Brief **2019** 



## **PROFILE**

The Brunei Darussalam-Indonesia-Malaysia-Philippines East ASEAN Growth Area (BIMP-EAGA) was established in 1994 to accelerate the socioeconomic development of less-developed, marginalized and geographically remote areas in these four countries as a broader goal to narrow development gaps. The BIMP-EAGA covers the entire sultanate of Brunei Darussalam; nine provinces in Kalimantan, Sulawesi, the island chains of Maluku and Papua (Indonesia); state of Sabah and Sarawak and Federal Territory of Labuan (Malaysia) and; Mindanao and Palawan (Philippines).

In addition, these states and provinces are vast, accounting for over 60% in land area of BIMP; but sparsely populated with less than 20% of BIMP's population and 18% of the labour force. The population density of EAGA is 48 persons per square kilometre. Despite these challenges, EAGA contributes about 17% of the total economic activity and 19.4% of total trade in BIMP.



The BIMP-EAGA covers a land area of **1.6 million** square kilometres which accounts for **62.4 percent** of the BIMP.

**Population** 

In 2018, the BIMP-EAGA had a combined population of **76.9 million.** That is equivalent to **19.1 percent** of BIMP's population. The BIMP-EAGA area is sparsely populated, with a a population density of **48 persons** per square kilometre.



The BIMP-EAGA accounted for **18.1**percent of the BIMP's total labor force.

**Labor Force** 

The EAGA GDP at constant prices was at **US\$216.69 billion** and accounted for **17.6 percent** of BIMP's GDP. The GDP was pegged at current PPP\$ recorded at **PPP\$953.1 billion**.

The EAGA trade in goods recorded at **US\$115.4 billion** and accounted for **19.4 percent** of the BIMP.
